Magic Words for Weight

You can now use the {{PATIENT_VITALS_WEIGHT}} magic word to output the patient's most recent weight and the units of the weight (e.g., 150 kg/g/lbs/etc.) in clinical paper forms.

You can also use the {{PATIENT_VITALS_WEIGHT_DATE}} magic word to output the date that the weight was measured in clinical paper forms.

See Problem Onset and Deceased Age in Family History

In the Family History subsection of the patient chart, you can now see the family member's age at the onset of a problem and the age at which the family member died (if applicable) without clicking the problem.








UnitedHealthcare Point of Care Assist (POCA) Features Will Be Removed on December 2, 2024

UnitedHealthcare will disable the POCA functionality on December 2, 2024 due to low utilization and use the athenaPayer Moment of Care Connections (MoCC) service instead. The existing MoCC functionality will not be impacted by this decommissioning and will remain accessible for the Medicare & Retirement (M&R) lines of business. Real-time benefit check will also not be affected.

Update to Clinical Provider Field Name on Order Documents

Previously, the recipient provider field for orders was named differently in the Assessment & Plan (Send to) and in the document view of the order (Clinical provider).

This change renames the **Clinical provider** field to **Send to** in the document view of the order to match the equivalent field name in the A&P:



If a clinical provider is not automatically selected in the order document, click the plus icon to search for a clinical provider.

Updated Clinical Evidence Labels for Suspected Diagnosis Gaps

Now, instead of labeling clinical evidence by the code system (for example, CPT and ICD-10), the Patient Risk dashboard labels evidence by the type of data:

Updated Layout of Delete Diagnosis Button

In the Assessment & Plan (A/P) section of the encounter, we added more separation between the **Delete Diagnosis** button and the other buttons on diagnosis cards. This change is intended to help prevent accidentally clicking the button.

• **Previously:** The buttons on the diagnosis card were evenly spaced.



• Now: We added a vertical bar and additional spacing between the Add Order and Delete Diagnosis buttons.
