

## Registries



Registries are a population management tool allowing users to define and explore patient populations using clinical and demographic data.

- A registry lists a set of data elements for each patient, including but not limited to demographics and relevant clinical data. The data elements can be sorted and filtered to assist in managing chronic conditions, monitoring preventive clinical parameters, and analyzing data for improvement.
- It is important to remember that registries <u>are not</u> measures. They do not show performance or trends. They are a population health tool that can be used to track patient care.
- Registries can be run retrospectively or prospectively. The registry
  defaults to today's date plus the previous 7 days. You can choose one of
  the standard date ranges or choose a custom range either by typing the
  dates you want in the box or clicking on the start and end date in the
  calendar. Run the registry for the past to review effectiveness of care
  and/or interventions. Run the registry for the future to aid in planning for
  upcoming appointments.
