

## Health Care for the Homeless - COVID-19 Continue to Work/Return to Work Guidelines^

<p>4. Staff member tests positive for COVID-19</p>	<p><b>NO</b></p>	<p>Do not report to work</p>	<p>If sx develop, wear a mask for 14 days after the onset of the sx or</p>	<p>Staff diagnosed w/COVID-19 may return to work when all three of the following have occurred:</p>

A household member w/COVID-like sx is awaiting testing or test results	<b>NO</b> Immediately alert supervisor + HR	Do not report to work while awaiting a household member's COVID results  May work from home if well enough + work available	Self-monitor for sx for 14 days <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Check temperature twice daily</li> <li>Fever (temp &gt;= 99.5°F)</li> <li>New cough (e.g., started in the last 14 days)</li> <li>Sore throat</li> <li>Chills/ shaking chills</li> <li>Shortness of breath</li> <li>Unexplained muscle aches</li> <li>Unexplained headache</li> <li>Loss of sense of taste or smell</li> </ul> <p>Consult w/your medical provider as needed or if sx develop. 6. A household member is sick, but not tested for COVID-19	<b>NO</b> Immediately alert supervisor + HR	Do not report to work until the household member has discussed their sx w/a medical provider	Household member should discuss whether their sx are consistent w/ COVID + test if appropriate  If <u>not</u> consistent w/ COVID, staff member should discuss w/ supervisor + HR	May return to work if household member's medical provider indicates that sx are <u>not</u> consistent w/ COVID  If sx <u>are</u> consistent w/COVID, see (7)

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\*Low risk exposure—brief interactions w/anyone w/ COVID-19 (including up to 2 day before their symptoms started) or prolonged close contact w/anyone wearing a facemask for source control

\*\*Medium risk exposure—prolonged close contact w/anyone w/COVID-19 (including up to 2 day before their symptoms started) who were wearing a facemask while staff member’s nose + mouth were exposed to material potentially infectious

\*\*\*High risk exposure—prolonged close contact w/anyone w/COVID-19 (including up to 2 day before their symptoms started) who were not wearing a facemask while staff member’s nose + mouth were exposed to material potentially infectious

^ Note: Abbreviation “sx” means “symptoms”
