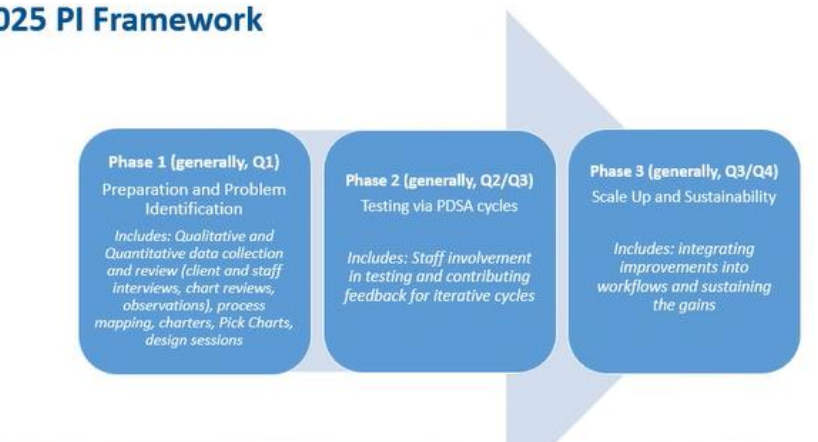

## 1. Reviewed PI framework

- Build on successes and make changes
- Reviewed plan for the year in a three phase approach: currently in phase 1**

### 2025 PI Framework



- Outlined goals and who are the champions
- Use lean teams; use of clinical champions and staff to test changes and provide feedback to ensure staff feedback is incorporated into the work

### 2025 PI Framework Continued

**Clinical and Operational Champions** = department leaders that collaborate on lean team and serve as co-POC for goal work

**Staff Champions** = collaborate via ad hoc and one-on-one meetings throughout the year, help test changes and provide feedback



## 2. Reviewed CQM data (full data breakdown in slides)

- YTD data so small sample size, but starting the year strong
- Highlighted that 100% for dental sealants
- Saw slight increases for most measures
- Saw referral (39%) and SDH ask rate (32%) increase

## 3. Reviewed PI measures

- Saw improvement in breast cancer, depression screening, flu offer, HTN disparity decrease
- Breast cancer screening – up to 46%; 5% away from goal for Black and AA women and 1% for white women
  - Currently doing process mapping, lit review, outreach to mercy to collaborate better with Mercy
  - Next up: data analysis, interviews, design sessions, testing and iterating PDSA, and scale up and sustain
- Depression screening and follow-up plan - up to 54%

- i. Currently doing data analysis, barrier identification (as most missed screening in medical), piloted an intake packet in Spanish and English; felt challenging to complete screenings independently. Use a cover sheet to circle any that have questions on
  - ii. Next up: roll out coversheet, process map, interviews, design interventions, testing and iterating, scale up and sustain
- d. Flu: seen great progress in this flu season; will focus again in 25-26
  - i. Next steps: close flu with successes and challenges; begin prep work, conduct lit review, testing and iterating
- e. HTN disparity – targeting work to improve HTN control for Black/AA women. Did see a 1% improvement!
  - i. Currently doing lit review, BP observations, client interviews, current state process map and medication algorithm review. Currently analyzing client interviews, with more to come.
  - ii. Next up: design interventions, testing and iterating via PDSA, and scale up and sustain
- f. Third next available app
  - i. Currently had learning session on template changes, call center observations, kick off meeting with operational champions
  - ii. Next up: literature review, process mapping, testing and iterating PDSA and scaling up

#### 4. PI tool of the month: **Process Maps**

##### PI Tool of the Month

##### Process Maps

- Allow for person to see and understand the flow of information or material as it makes its way through the process/visual representation from start to finish
- Drawn in current state to help inform future state (minimize waste and achieve value in each step)
  - Shows waste/gaps in process for targeted intervention
- Shows interrelationships between activities and information in end-to-end way
- Provides a common language
- Helps ensure all elements of a process are working together

- Provided example of dental referrals process map
- Recommend using a whiteboard to start getting ideas; also recommend multiple meetings to ensure that we are covering all pieces and getting it right
- Always include title, owner, when last updated, can put in key players
- Use cloud signals for challenges, gaps, waste so easily identifiable
- Dependencies and other routes = diamond (with yes or no)
- Use [www.drawio.com](http://www.drawio.com) (free) process maps or org charts
- Walked through with the committee on the flow of their morning routine
